

A Bill to Reform the Immigration and Nationality Act

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED TODAY:

SECTION 1: Section 301 of the Immigration and Nationality Act shall be amended to provide citizenship at birth for a person born in the United States with at least one parent being a citizen, permanent resident, or immigrant in the military.

SECTION 2: Permanent resident shall be defined as someone authorized to live and work in the United States (a green card holder). Permanent residents are eligible if they have been green card holders for at least three years and lived in the U.S. for at least eight years.

SECTION 3: The U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement will be responsible for making and enforcing this change.

SECTION 4: Will be put into action January 1, 2019.

SECTION 5: All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
